

RE Topics

The Way, The Truth and The Life topics for this term are:

- The Bible-learning about the Bible as a collection of books and different people in the Bible
- Trust in God-As Christians we are called to always trust in God's love for us

English

Reading: The children will study different text types (fiction and non-fiction) and continue to develop reading fluency, comprehension strategies and a love for reading.

Writing: Children will be taught to structure their writing accurately and creatively. They will work on writing a variety of texts, editing their work and writing for different audiences.

Punctuation, spelling and handwriting will be of utmost importance.

Grammar: Children will learn about word classes, tense and prefixes/suffixes.

Speaking: Through discussion, presentation and targeted questioning, children will be continuously encouraged to voice their opinions clearly and confidently.

Maths

Children will work on:

Place value up to 100 000. Times tables. Counting in sequences. Rounding numbers. Roman numerals. Telling the time. Fractions and percentages. Working with graphs. Money. Conversions between measures. Naming, comparing and describing shapes.

All of the above will be taught as arithmetic and applied Maths (word problems)

It is vital that the children know their times tables 0-12x

Science

Electricity: Children will learn what electricity is and how to make electrical circuits

Living things and their habitats: Children will study the characteristics of living thing and the importance of their habitats, explore food chains and webs and recognise that the environment can change.

Geography

Children will study maps of the British Isles and they will explore Britain's settlement by Anglo- Saxons and Scots and where the Anglo- Saxons and Scots came from.

History:

Children will learn about who the Saxons were, aspects of their daily life such as village life, clothing, religion, the Saxons army and their leaders, famous Saxons stories and archaeological finds. They will try to understand how the Anglo-Saxons changed Britain.
