Task 1

1. What is the New Commandment?

“You must love God with all your heart and soul, and your neighbour as yourself”
(John 13:34-35)

2. What does Jesus say about those who want to follow him?

“If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, he must deny himself, take up his cross daily and follow me” (Luke 9:23)

3. What does St John say about the way we should love?

“My children, our love is not to be just words or mere talk, but something alive and active...” (1 John 3:18)

5. How many times did Jesus say we should forgive?

“Not seven, but 70 times 7” (Matthew 18:22)

6. What does Jesus say about the way we should treat our enemies and those who persecute us?

“You must love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you”
(Matthew 5:44)

7. The Beatitudes (2 marks for each correct answer)

a) What does Jesus say about the poor in spirit?

“Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.”

b) What does Jesus say about the meek?

“Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth.”

c) What does Jesus say about the merciful?

“Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy.”

d) What does Jesus say about those who protect others from bullying?

“Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called the children of God.”

e) What does Jesus say to those who tell the truth and stand up for what is right?

“Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied.” (Matthew 5:6-11)

8. What did Jesus say about those who were crucifying him?

“Father, forgive them for they know not what they do” (Luke 23:34)

9. St Paul explains what Jesus meant by love. What did he say?

“Love is always patient and kind;

it is never jealous,

love is never boastful or conceited;

it is never rude or selfish;

it does not take offence, and is not resentful.

Love takes no pleasure in other people’s sins

but delights in the truth;

it is always ready to excuse, to trust, to hope,

and to endure whatever comes” (1Corinthians 13:4-7).

10. What prayer did St Francis say for peace?

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace.

Where there is hatred, let me sow love;

Where there is injury, pardon;

Where there is doubt, faith;

Where there is despair, hope;

Where there is darkness, light;

Where there is sadness, joy.
