Year 4: Amanda

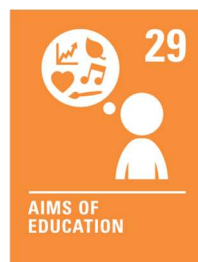

Big Ask

The new Children's Commissioner for England, Rachel de Souza has written to say

"My job is to speak up for children in England, stand up for their rights, and make sure that the people in power listen to what children need and want.

It's time to give something big back to young people like you after COVID — and we need your help to do it.

This is the largest ever survey of children and young people in England. We'll use what you tell us to show the government what you think, and what children need to live happier lives.

This survey will only take you 5-10 minutes."

The Big Ask is a survey for children and young people aged 4–17 in England. We've split the survey into different age groups, so you can fill in a version appropriate for your age. We've also made easy-read 'accessible' versions as well as a version for care leavers.

We won't ask for your name, phone number or email, and we'll keep what you tell us safe and private – it won't be shared with anyone else. You don't have to answer any question if you don't want to.

The Alzheimer's Society is the UK's leading dementia charity. They campaign for change, fund research to find a cure and support people living with dementia. Dementia is the UK's biggest killer. Someone develops it every three minutes and there's currently no cure. Children and staff are invited to wear their finest denim to School on Friday 21 May in return for a donation to the Alzheimer's Society. Donations should be made on Parentpay please. We are asking for a minimum of £1 per family with a maximum of £20 so people can choose an amount to suit their pocket.
