Who is Jesus for you? In today's Gospel, John calls Jesus the Lamb of God and thus signifies Jesus' mission as the One who redeems us from our sins. The blood of the *Passover Lamb* delivered the people of the covenant from their oppression in Egypt and from the plague of death. The Lord Jesus freely offered up his life for us on the cross as the atoning sacrifice for our sins.

It is significant that John was the son of the priest, Zachariah, who participated in the daily sacrifice of a lamb in the temple for the sins of the people. In Jesus John saw the true and only sacrifice which could deliver us from bondage to sin, eternal death, and the powers of hell.

John in his characteristic humility was eager to point beyond himself to the Christ. He did not hesitate to direct his own disciples to Jesus. When two of John's disciples began to seek Jesus out, Jesus took the

initiative to invite them into his company. He did not wait for them to get his attention. Instead he met them halfway. He asked them one of the most fundamental questions of life: "What are you looking for?"

Jesus asks each one of us the same question: "What are you searching for? Do you know the meaning and purpose for your life?". That is why the Lord Jesus invites each one of us to draw near to himself. He wants us to know him personally - to know what he came to do for us and what he wants to offer us.

MORE FAMILY PALM TREES: Many thanks to those who were able to collect a palm tree last week. I bought 32 palms and they were all joyfully taken by those who attended the 6.30pm Mass. As I mentioned in the announcements, more palms are available this week for you take home. Kindly collect a Palm Tree from the Welcome Ministers or from the sanctuary, grow them until Palm Sunday and bring them back to church for the Palm Sunday decorations. May your family's palm tree adorn our Holy Cross church. After the Holy Week celebrations you may take them back home and bring them again next year. May this tree be also a sign of God's blessing growing in your family home.

Sunday Apostles: I am planning to start various catechetical programmes in our parish on

Sundays from March this year. Every first and third Sundays will be the time of learning about the Bible and Catholic teachings through Sunday Bible Classes from 10am to 11am. How to Look after the Palm Tree:

Place in a light area out of direct sunlight, as this will damage the leaves.

The growing medium should be moist, but allow it to dry out a little between waterings.

A lower temperature could affect the plant, they prefer a warm climate and are sensitive to draughts.

Areca palms are best kept indoors. This plant humidifies air so making it ideal for offices or homes with dry air.
