This week's Gospel tells us about Jesus' visit to the Synagogue to preach, where He was listened to with great respect, however they did so because He spoke with 'authority' not because they knew who He was.

As He was leaving He was accosted by a man with an 'unclean' spirit. This man recognised Jesus for who He was ... "I know who you are: the Holy One of God". Jesus responded by driving out the unclean spirit which astonished the onlookers and set them pondering on who this new teacher was and what authority let Him give orders to even drive out unclean spirits. It's interesting to note that this unclean spirit immediately knows who Jesus is. This is because each of two opposites emphasises the other very clearly. For example, black is most clearly seen when it is placed in front of something white.

Someone who undergoes a 'spiritual conversion' sees clearly the difference between their old and new lives in Jesus. However those of us who are already trying to 'perfect' our spiritual lives will probably not see such a contrast. The ideal for every Christian is to eventually experience less contrasting spiritual experiences and more that are gentle and subtle as our Lord continues to gently perfect us in many ways.

**Bring back your Old Palms:** For the Ash Wednesday liturgy we are going to prepare the ashes with your old palms. Kindly bring them back to the church and place them in the boxes placed in the porches.

How to Look after the Palm Tree: Place in a light area out of direct sunlight, as this will damage the leaves.

The growing medium should be moist, but allow it to dry out a little between waterings. A lower temperature could affect the plant, they prefer a warm climate and are sensitive to draughts.

Areca palms are best kept indoors. This plant humidifies air so making it ideal for offices or homes with dry air.
