MAN'S CAPACITY FOR GOD; The Desire for God [please read Catechism of the Catholic Church - nos. 27-30]

We are made with a built-in desire for God. No matter where you come from or who you are, God created you to know Him and crave a connection with Him. It's only in this relationship that we find

true fulfilment and lasting happiness. This is a key part of what makes being human so special!

Finding God Through History

Throughout time and across cultures, people have expressed this longing for God in different ways – through prayer, traditions, and a spiritual search. Even when there's confusion, this basic desire to connect with something greater shows how faith is part of us.



When Things Get in the Way

The world can get noisy and confusing—bad things happen, people disappoint us, and we chase temporary happiness. Sometimes it's hard to keep that connection with God at the centre. But here's the amazing part: God never gives up on us. God Calls Us Back

Even when we lose our way, God is calling us back, offering peace and belonging. Finding our way to Him takes honesty, openness, and sometimes help from our faith community. As Catholics, we believe the most profound way to experience God's love is through Jesus Christ and the community of the Church.
