## CATHOLIC FAITH [PART 3]

MAN'S CAPACITY FOR GOD; Ways of Coming to Know God [please read Catechism of the Catholic Church - no 31-35] GOD IS CARVING OUT YOUR SOUL TO CREATE A GREATER CAPACITY FOR HIS POWER.

The existence of God is not relegated to blind faith. As beings formed in His image, we're given ways to engage our reason to apprehend His presence.

Reasoning from Creation: Nature presents a compelling testimony to a Divine Architect. Order, complexity and a sense of purposeful beauty – from the cosmic to the molecular – point toward a transcendent Creator. Through careful consideration of the natural world, we can acknowledge God as the ultimate First Cause, unmoved and unchanging.

Reasoning from the Spirit: Humans possess a longing for something more, a thirst for truth and beauty that materialism cannot quench. Our yearning for goodness, freedom, and the search for a deeper meaning reflect our spiritual soul – the mark of our divine design. Recognizing this internal compass helps us see a spiritual dimension to reality, pointing us toward its Creator.

Reason within Revelation: These signs aren't mathematical equations proving God; they are pathways, invitations to consider and open ourselves to Divine revelation. The Catholic faith recognizes that while human reason plays a role, a true, intimate relationship with God goes beyond what we can fully understand. God reveals Himself through history, particularly through Jesus. Faith accepts this revelation, allowing us to move beyond a philosophical idea of God into a vibrant communion with Him.

- Which evidence of God seems most powerful to you? Why?
- Has a moment with nature ever left you feeling closer to God?

#### **Questions to Discuss in our Families**

- Why is it important to not just believe in God, but to seek a relationship with Him?
- Can you think of another example of how the world or human nature point to God?
  - How can we help others open their eyes to see God's work around them?
