
## Stephen Schwartz Composer of the Week




The Juilliard School is a performing arts conservatory in New York City. It was founded in 1905 and is one of the world's leading institutions for music and performing arts education.

Some of the most famous performers in the world studied there.












"Godspell" is known for its catchy tunes and upbeat energy, and its message of love and acceptance has made it a favorite of audiences for decades.










"Pippin" is a musical that tells the story of a young prince trying to find meaning in his life.

"Wicked" premiered on Broadway in 2003 and has become one of the most successful musicals of all time, winning numerous awards, with productions all around the world.




