


On Monday it is Earth Day, the theme for this year is Planet vs Plastics. In School we will be thinking about small changes we could all make

Composer of the Week: Samuel Coleridge-Taylor



This week, we have been celebrating the remarkable achievements of Samuel Coleridge-Taylor, a pioneering composer who left an indelible

mark on the world of classical music. Born in London in 1875, Coleridge-Taylor rose to prominence as a composer, conductor, and professor, despite facing racial prejudice in his lifetime. His most famous work, the cantata "Hiawatha's Wedding Feast," garnered widespread acclaim and remains a beloved classic to this day. Coleridge-Taylor's compositions often drew inspiration from African and British musical traditions, showcasing his unique artistic voice and cultural heritage. Through his music, he broke barriers and paved the way for future generations of Black composers.
