









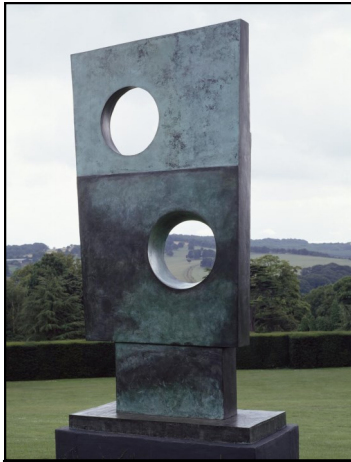

Key Vocabulary		
sculpture		The art of making two- or three-dimensional forms.
three dimensional (3D)		Three-dimensional art pieces are presented in the dimensions of height, width and depth.
statue		A three-dimensional representation produced by sculpturing, modelling, or casting.
models		Representing an object in a miniature form using clay or wax.
rolling		To move an art material along a surface by turning over and over, as a ball or a wheel.
pinching		To use your fingers to pinch or push sections of the clay to create your desired shapes.
cutting		To cut or cut off or out.
shaping		To give form and shape.
twisting		To wind or coil something about something else.
evaluation		To study carefully and judge.



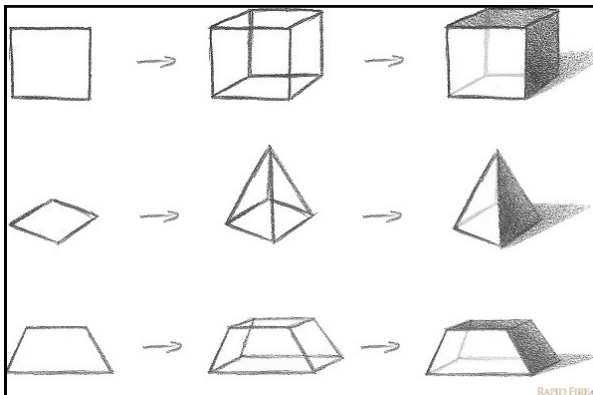
